And it's not just for instructors, attendees will learn skills for communicating with your audience, whether it's teaching in a classroom or giving a presentation at the office.

Unfortunately, we will need to pay the hotel for use of the seminar rooms on Sunday, so we ask that if you are interested in attending OT3 or Instructor Recertification, you register by checking the box on the conference registration. If there is insufficient interest, we will not book the rooms and reschedule the seminars for another time and place.

I hope you like these changes to our district event and will take advantage of the combined programs. These events are not for the district officers, they are for you, the membership, to give you the

opportunity to learn and share your ideas with others. I hope you'll take advantage of these opportunities and register today.



USING DB2000 AND SAIL ANGLE

DB2000 and Sail Angle are great tools to help you keep in touch with your members....but, they are a bear to learn how to navigate around in them.

We plan to take the mystery out of these programs and help you feel confident in using them. These are the subjects of a technology seminar at the Spring Conference.

DB2000 is nothing more than a database. It holds information about your members and helps you keep in touch with them. The easiest way to use it is to download your roster into Excel and then manipulate the information into smaller usable buckets. We will explain step-by-step how to do that. Once you have mastered this valuable, basic function, you can explore on your own all the other applications available to you.

Sail Angle is a little more complicated. It is another form of social media similar to Facebook or Twitter.

The size of the program and the multiple applications can be intimidating. We will show you how to handle a few basic functions that will get you started and help build your confidence:

- How to send a group message,
- How to store something in the file cabinet, and retrieve it.
- How to send an invitation for your dinner meetings and put it on your squadron calendar.

If we have time, we will show you how to store photographs and attach them to your messages.

This is one workshop you do not want to miss. Learn how to put these tools to work for you.
